

Spotlight on Sheila Ann Garver Hansberger

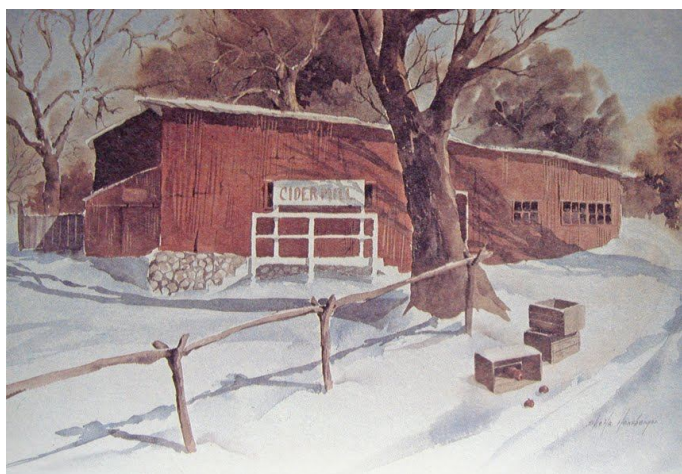
Life after Azusa High School

When it wasn't apple season, I worked as a free-lance commercial artist and eventually used my talents while I worked for a printing firm as their in-house artist. Since the 1980's my career has gone in the direction of fine art, in watercolor. I create paintings which are sold through galleries and art shows. No, I do not yet have a web-site, but it's coming. My work has been featured on the web and in various magazines and is a part of several permanent collections owned by institutions such as the National Orange Show, Mt. San Jacinto College, the San Bernardino County Museum, various banks, medical centers and other enterprises.
