Life after Azusa High School

Tom Roberts and Carol Justice attended elementary school together and graduated from Azusa High School in 1961. They started going steady when they were 16 and in June of 2008 they will celebrate their 44th wedding anniversary. They have two children, a boy and a girl, plus two granddaughters and a grandson.



Tom and Carol are both survivors. Their strength and faith have helped them overcome many obstacles in life. When they were 29 years old they were in a horrible dune buggy accident in San Felipe, Mexico. The dune buggy caught fire and Carol suffered third degree burns on 55% of her body and second degree burns everywhere else. She was treated in the burn unit of the hospital for over three months and had to undergo several skin grafts and months of painful physical therapy. Tom was also hospitalized for burns, although his were not as severe as Carol's.

Several years later Tom was thrown off his motorcycle and landed at the bottom of a rocky canyon in San Clemente after he hit a tree branch that extended over the roadway. It took nine months for his bones to heal. He showed up at a job interview wearing a cast and bandages on his head, arms and legs. He got the job.

For the past several years Carol has suffered from rheumatoid arthritis, and a few years ago had knee replacement surgery because her joint was damaged beyond repair. Even though it's painful when she does the activities she enjoys so much she's truly an inspiration to everyone. In a recent email she said, "To do any of the things I do anymore is very hard on the RA (rheumatoid arthritis) as it is always very painful, but the joy and happiness I get out of doing these things outweighs the pain. It's kind of a mindset thing."

Work

After graduating high school Tom worked for Carol's father for seven years as an apprentice bricklayer. From there he went to work for a beer distributing company for the next 22 years. He was Executive Vice President when the company was sold, but he continued working at the distributing company, under the new ownership, for two more years. After a short sabbatical Tom landed a job as a sales rep for one of the nation's largest distributor of packing materials and moving and storage equipment. His territory is Phoenix, Las Vegas and Southern California. He loves his job and probably won't retire for at least a couple more years.

Carol recently retired after working for Pacific Care Dental & Vision for 16 years.

Tom and Carol are both adventurous and enjoy living life to its fullest. Carol celebrated her 64th birthday by jumping out of a plane in San Diego. This skydiving adventure came after she had knee replacement surgery. After she recovered from her dune buggy accident – after she was told that she would never be able to lift her right arm again - Carol went on to become a Class B tennis player at her club in Vista, where she played in tournaments for eight years.

They are avid fishers and while vacationing at Clear Lake in Oregon Carol caught a seven-pound bass after a 15-minute fight to bring it in.
